

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter consist of two section, the first section deals with the conclusion of findings of the research and the second deals with suggestion.

5.1 Conclusion

Based on the findings and discussion in the previous chapter, it can be concluded that there are some findings related to the obstacles faced by students in determining research titles.

1. Obstacle in determining research titles that are in accordance with interests (Table 4.2): The majority of respondents (75%) had obstacles in determining research titles that are in accordance with interests. This shows that the problem of determining the title according to interest is a major challenge for many respondents.
2. Obstacle finding a research title that suits academic abilities (Table 4.3): 80% of respondents feel unsure of their academic abilities, indicating a major problem in determining research title.
3. Limited of literature (Table 4.4) Most of the respondents (95%) felt that they often limited of literature when determining research title, indicating that literature problem were a significant issue in their determining research title process.
4. Lack of personal motivation (Table 4.5): 90% of the respondents had obstacle in lack of personal motivation, indicating obstacle in determining research title.

5. Uncertainty about the relevance of the topic (Table 4.6) : 85% of the respondents had obstacle in uncertainty about the relevance of the topic, indicating the challenge faced by determining a research title.
6. Limited time (Table 4.7). The majority of respondents (95%) had obstacles in limited time for determining research title. This shows that the problem of time was a major challenge for many respondents.
7. Lack of reference or relevant literature (Table 4.8). Most of the respondents (95%) felt that they often lacked reference when determining research title, indicating that reference problem were a significant issue in their research title process.
8. Lack of in-depth knowledge of the research topic (table 4.9). 50% of the respondents felt that they lacked in-depth knowledge when determining research title. Indicating that knowledge is a fairly common problem among them.
9. Uncertainty about the focus or scope of the topic (table 4.10). The majority of respondents (95%) were uncertain about the focus or scope of their topic, indicating a major problem in terms of certainty in deciding on a research title.
10. Lack of ideas or inspiration for a research topic (table 4.11). Most respondents (95%) felt that there was a lack of ideas or inspiration for research topics, indicating that ideas are a significant issue in the process of determining research titles.

11. Limited finances or resources (table 4.12). A total of 50% of respondents felt limited finances or resources in determining research titles. This suggests that limited resources is a fairly common problem among them.
12. Lack of experience in a particular area of research (table 4.13). The majority of respondents (95%) had problems deciding on a research title due to lack of experience. This shows that one of the main challenges for many respondents in determining a research title is due to lack of experience.
13. Obstacle managing existing resources effectively (table 4.14). Most respondents (85%) experienced barriers to managing existing resources effectively, indicating that effective resource management is a significant issue in the process of determining research titles.
14. Obstacle in gaining access to relevant data or source of information (table 4.15). A total of 90% of respondents felt that they experienced barriers in gaining access to relevant data or information when wanting to determine their research title, indicating that access to information data is a major problem in determining research titles.
15. The difference between personal interest and research needs (table 4.16). As many as 75% of respondents have obstacles in the difference between personal interests and research needs, this shows that the above obstacle in determining research titles are a challenge for many respondents.

From the data obtained through the questionnaire as a whole, the author found findings that identified that students face obstacle related to interests, suits academic abilities, Limited of literature, personal motivation, Uncertainty the

relevance of the topic, limited time, Lack of knowledge, limited resources and Lack of ideas or inspiration.

5.2 Suggestion

Based on the conclusions drawn from the research, the following suggestions are offered to address the obstacles identified:

1. For Students:

Students should choose research topics that genuinely interest them and align with their personal knowledge and expertise. It is important for students to have a broad perspective and actively seek solutions to overcome the challenges in determining a research title. Engaging in discussions with peers, mentors, or academic advisors can also provide valuable insights and support in this process.

2. For Researchers:

Future researchers are encouraged to build upon this study by exploring additional dimensions of the challenges faced in determining research titles. This research can serve as a reference for further investigations and provide guidance for improving data collection methods. Researchers should consider developing strategies to address the identified obstacles, such as creating resources or support systems to assist students in navigating these challenges effectively.
